1.0 BACKGROUND

Requisite modifications to the design of the proposed new mill site beside Gunns Ltd's. existing plant at Long Reach have entailed assessment of additional areas not included in the original series of reports tendered by this consultant. This report details the results of assessment work done on three additional areas. These being:

- Mill Access approximately (19ha)
- Conveyor belt approximately (4ha)
- Windermere Rd approximately (1ha)

2.0 METHODOLOGY


These localities were examined on foot and any sites located were recorded photographically, and their locations obtained using hand held GPS technology. Fieldwork was undertaken over a two day period in December, 2005.

3.0 SUMMARY OF RESULTS

During the assessment of all three localities, only one historic feature was found and this was a botanical feature. Its minimal cultural significance precludes any further action on behalf of the client unless further cultural remains are located in the vicinity of this feature during ground breaking activities.

Significance: Minimal Significance.		
Recommendations: If any occupational remains are discovered during clearance of this vicinity, it should be reported to the relevant management authority and an archaeologist engaged to record the site and make further recommendations.
